

Our Journey with Literature Author: Malik Al-Mostafa Preparatory 2A

From the start of the academic year, one of our most important studies in English was literature. We studied a lot in literature, like how to write a narrative, our novel, figurative language, foreshadowing, cliffhangers, and the show not tell technique.

Knowing how to write a narrative is a must in English, because it may even help in our future life and work. So, from an early age we should know how to write a proper narrative with an opening, an ending and of course the story itself. A narrative must have an interesting opening to grab the reader's attention, which we learned from our lessons. And it must have a lot of different ways to stop it from being boring, one of which is the show not tell technique. This technique doesn't tell the reader the character's emotions, but you give the reader the actions that the character is making so he can conclude his feelings which makes your narrative more interesting.

Flashbacks, flashbacks are when you get back with the timeline to a certain year to show the reader a certain action or in some narratives, the story starts normally in the present time to tell the story itself in a flashback.

They are quite interesting because they don't make you get bored or distracted. Flashbacks always make the reader more involved in the events.

Another way of making your narrative interesting is foreshadowing and cliffhangers. Foreshadowing and cliffhangers are that the author, which is you, puts clues all across the story so the reader can partially expect the rest of the actions in the story, which makes him so eager to read the rest of the story to see if his expectations were right or wrong.

Conflicts, conflicts are problems or twists between two characters. Most of the conflicts are usually solved, and the reason most people use them is to make the readers take a certain character's side, which also puts them in his shoe. What do you get from conflicts? you may ask; conflicts make the reader pay attention while being extremely eager to know how it will end for their favourite character.

Last but not least, figurative language. Figurative language believe it ,or not is used daily. We use it sometimes to exaggerate something ,or to be even funny. As for the narratives, it's used to show the reader nearly the exact way ,or time or whatever you want them to know the character did.







TOFAS EXAMINATION








ART AND CRAFT







ART GALLERY Production Day







Understanding your child's needs

Children's needs and behaviours change as they get older, and understanding these needs will help you better understand your child. A lot has been written about the needs of children and advice for parents, and we cover some of the key areas here. .

How can I set boundaries?

All children need love, guidance and to have rules and boundaries. Rules and boundaries help families to understand how to behave towards each other, and what's OK and not OK. But the best way to go about this will vary based on your child's age and stage of development. All children are different and develop and reach milestones at different rates.



1. Babies

Babies behave as they do to get their needs met. For example, when they cry they're trying to tell you that they need something – maybe they're hungry, need their nappy changed or feel tired.

Older babies may show what appears like a 'stubborn streak' – spitting out food or wriggling away from a nappy change. All they are doing is trying to express their likes and dislikes in the only way they can.

When you're stressed you may feel your baby is being 'deliberately naughty' or trying to provoke you. This is not possible. Remember you should never shout at, scream at, hit, shake or smack a baby.

2. Toddlers

All toddlers test limits and have tantrums. Research shows that a child's brain is still developing during this period, so there are limits to how much they're able to control their emotions. Remember that behaviour in toddlers which is often seen as naughty is actually quite normal and part of growing up.

3. School age

School-age children are constantly learning and exploring their world. They may have lots of questions as they start to form their own views on issues. As they move towards being more independent they may seem to push boundaries and become more challenging. This is a necessary part of growing up.

4. Teenagers

As children continue to develop their own identities in their teenage years, they might become more challenging sometimes seeming 'moody' or withdrawn, or not as talkative and open as their parents would like. They might be more inclined to disagree with their parents, or choose different views. Friends (and celebrities) will become a bigger influence and your child may not always do what you would like.
